

## BOR APPROVES REPAIR BOND ISSUE FOR YET-TO-BE-BUILT HONORS and International Center

In an unscheduled but unsurprising "let's pass this while people are on vacation" meeting in August, The Western's<sup>TM</sup> Board of Regents approved a \$10 million bond issue to renovate and refurbish the yet-to-bebuilt HONORS and international center in 2019.
